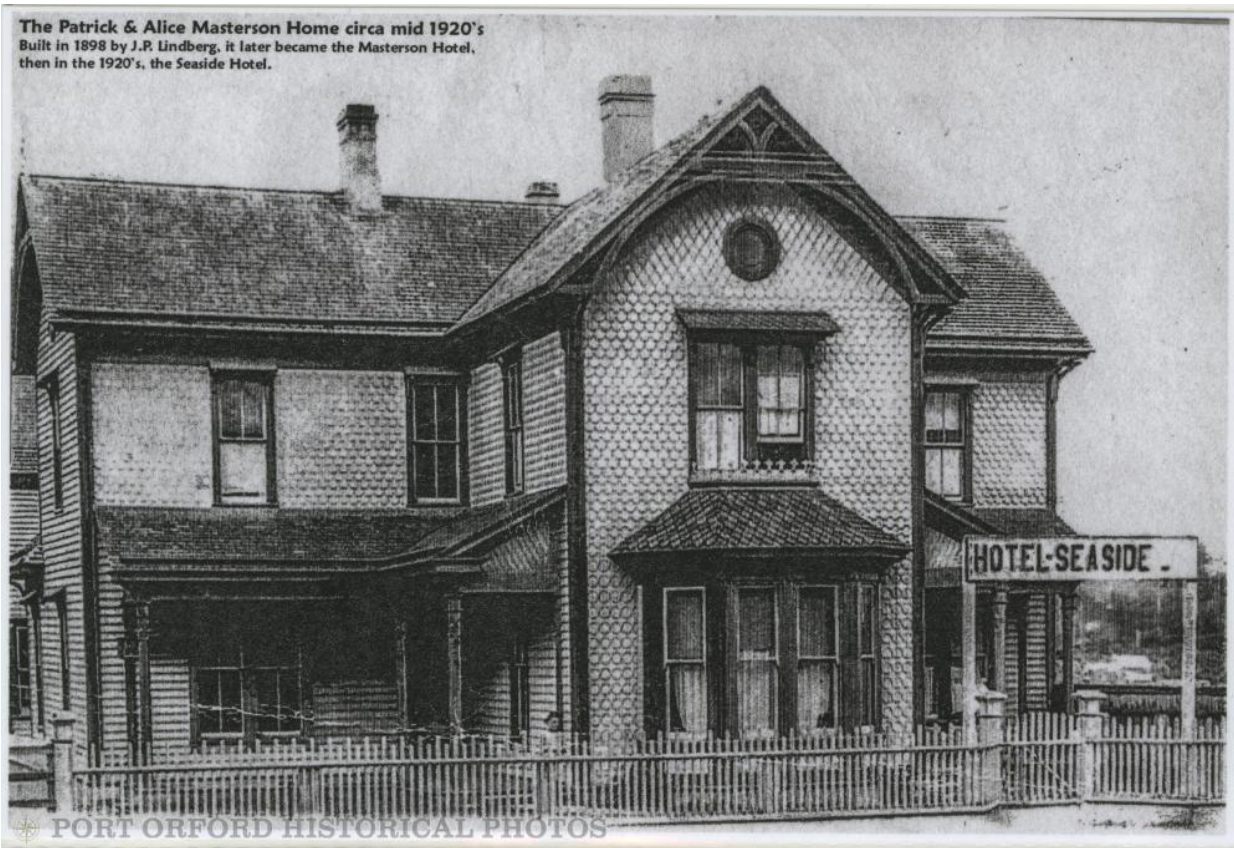
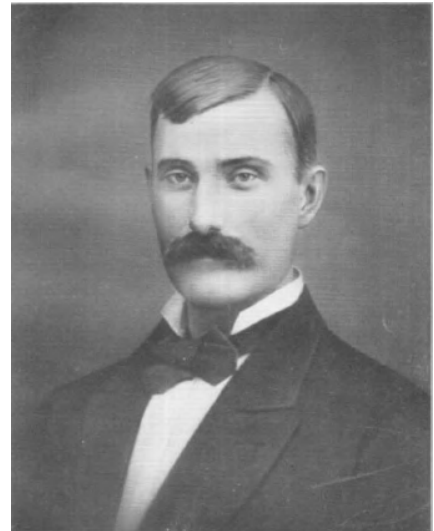


1. Seaside Hotel (The Lindberg/Masterson House)



A photo of the grand Masterson House as it looked when it functioned as the Seaside Hotel in the 1920's. The Masterson's leased out the Seaside hotel to several different people in the 20's. John Masterson took over the business in 1929 and into the 30's. The Masterson house at Jackson and 6th (also called the Painted Lady), the Long house on Eighth and Jefferson and Leon White's home on Fifth and Washington are among the better known J.P. Lindberg houses in Port Orford. Few people realize that he built one of the early bridges over the Sixes River and helped to repair and rebuild an early storm-damaged dock in Port Orford. This lovely gem of architecture in Port Orford retains much of its historic features, however it is in need of TLC to stand the test of time.
